IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED

AN ACT to Permit Liquor Sales on Election Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 4, 4th ¶, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 741, § 2 is repealed as follows:

~~Liquor may be sold in any municipality on the day of holding a general election or state wide primary after the polls of that municipality have closed~~

28 MRSA § 4, 6th ¶, 2nd sentence, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 770, § 131 is repealed as follows:

~~Except that wholesalers of malt beverages and table wine may make deliveries to licensees on the day of holding a general election or state wide primary~~

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill repeals the law banning the sale of liquor on election day.
