STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide Continued Educational Benefits for Veterans' Widows after Remarriage.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

37-A MRSA \S 50-J, 2nd \P , as amended by PL 1975, c. 701, \S 21, is further amended by adding the following new sentence at the end:

The remarriage of the widow or widower of a veteran shall not bar the furnishings of benefits to the widow or widower of the veteran if the remarriage has been terminated by death or has been dissolved by a divorce.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will allow the spouse of a deceased veteran to receive educational assistance in cases where he or she remarries and the subsequent marriage is terminated. He or she would still not be eligible for benefits until the subsequent marriage terminated. Federal veterans' benefits already provide for this contingency.
