IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Require the Public Utilities Commission to Investigate the Establishment of a Separate Customer Charge Classification for Electric Service to Any Grange of the Patrons of Husbandry.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

35 MRSA § 2315 is enacted to read:

§ 2315. Separate service charge classification for certain organizations

Within one year from the effective date of this section, the Public Utilities Commission shall undertake a formal investigation to determine whether any electric company, as defined by section 15, subsection 5, shall establish a separate customer charge classification for electric service for all granges of the patrons of husbandry duly incorporated under the laws of the State.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require the Public Utilities Commission to investigate the establishment of a separate customer charge classification for electric service to any grange of the patrons of husbandry.
