STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT Concerning Unemployment Benefits for Persons Mandatorily Retired because of Age.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

26 MRSA § 1193. sub-§ 1. ¶B is amended to read:

B. For the duration of his unemployment period subsequent to his having voluntarily retired; or having been retired from his regular employment as a result of a recognized employer policy or program, under which he is entitled to receive pension payments, if so found by the commission, and disqualification shall continue until claimant has earned 6 times his weekly benefit amount. Notwithstanding the provisions of this paragraph, no person shall be eligible for pension benefits while receiving unemployment benefits;

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will allow people who have been mandatorily retired to receive unemployment benefits and preclude a person from receiving pension and unemployment benefits simultaneously.
