## STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide for Aid to Families with Dependent Children Benefits for Unemployed Parents under the Aid to Families with Dependent Children -Unemployed Fathers Program.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

22 MRSA § 3741, as repealed and replaced by PL 1967, c. 459, § 1, is amended by adding at the end a new sentence to read:

The department shall also implement and operate a program of aid to the dependent children of intact families with unemployed parents in accordance with the United States Code, Title 42, section 607 and any amendments and additions thereto.

**Sec. 2.** Appropriation. The following funds shall be appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will enable families in which there is an unemployed parent of dependent children to choose between Aid to Families with Dependent Children benefits or unemployment compensation when they are unemployed. By allowing this option, families for which unemployment compensation does not provide for even minimum existence, can choose 70% federally funded program as an alternative, assure some medical care coverage and keep the family together. Cost figures estimated by the Department of Human Services are valued for the first year to allow for start time, notice of availability and other factors.
