STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Make Arson a Class A Crime under the Maine Criminal Code.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 17-A MRSA § 801, as amended by PL 1977, c. 510, § 66, is repealed.
- **Sec. 2. 17-A MRSA § 802, sub-§ 3,** as enacted by PL 1975, c. 499, § 1, is amended to read:
 - Arson is a Class B A crime.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make all forms of arson Class A crimes. In light of the change in the penalty for violating Title 17-A, section 802, the crime of aggravated arson, Title 17-A, section 801, becomes superfluous, since the same conduct is covered, in more general terms, in Title 17-A, section 802.
