STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Provide an Income Tax Credit for Installation of Insulation in Residences.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

36 MRSA § 5127, sub-§ 3, is enacted to read:

3. Income tax credit for installation of insulation. A Maine resident shall be allowed a credit against the tax otherwise due under chapter 805 in the amount of 20% of the purchase price of insulation installed in a dwelling owned by him. In no case may this credit exceed \$75 and in no case may this credit reduce the state income tax to less than zero.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides for a state income tax credit of 20% of the purchase price of installed insulation. The amount of the credit is limited, however, to a maximum of \$75.

This bill provides a significant incentive for owners of dwellings to install insulation in those dwellings and thus is an important energy conservation measure.
