# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

### AN ACT to Facilitate Absentee Voting in Foreign Jurisdictions.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

21 MRSA § 1254, sub-§ 1, 2nd sentence, as amended by PL 1967, c. 163, is further amended to read:

When he is outside the State, the voter must mark his ballot before a notary public having a seal or before any diplomatic or consular official of the United States or, before the master of a United States registered vessel of 1,000 tons or more or before the functional equivalent of a notary public of a foreign country if accompanied by a certificate of that foreign official's authority.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would allow an absentee voter to mark his ballot before certain foreign officials.
