## AN ACT to Extend the New Jobs Credit Provisions under the Statutes Relating to Taxation.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- **Sec. 1. 36 MRSA § 5213, sub-§ 1, ¶ D**, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 686, § 15, is amended to read:
  - **D.** "Successor-taxpayer" means any taxpayer which has acquired within 4 years of its the taxable year end in 1978 for which a credit is taken, the organization, trade or business, or 50% or more of the assets thereof, of another taxpayer which, at the time of the acquisition, was an employing unit.
- Sec. 2. 36 MRSA § 5213, sub-§ 2, first sentence, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 686, § 15, is amended to read:

A taxpayer which constitutes an employing unit is allowed a credit in the amount of 2% of that taxpayer's new jobs credit base for the each taxable year ending in 1978.

**Sec. 3. 36 MRSA § 5213, sub-§ 3**, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 686, § 15, is repealed.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to extend the jobs credit provisions enacted in the second regular session of the 108th Legislature. That legislation provided for a one time 2% credit on the increment over the previous year in taxable wages under the Employment Security Law.
