STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SEVENTY-NINE

RESOLVE, to Provide Minimum Retirement Benefits for Mrs. Elizabeth Ramsay of South Portland.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Mrs. Elizabeth Ramsay; minimum retirement benefits authorized. Resolved: That, notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Maine State Retirement System shall provide Mrs. Elizabeth Ramsay of South Portland with a retirement benefit of \$100 a month, for the remainder of her lifetime, unless she becomes the dependent of another person, at which time the benefits shall cease.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill provides a minimum retirement benefit of \$100 a month, and thereafter as adjusted for cost-of-living by Title 5, section 1128, to Mrs. Elizabeth Ramsay for the rest of her life or until she becomes the dependent of another person. Mrs. Ramsay is the widow of the late Charles Ramsay, formerly with the Portland Police Department.
