HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 391, L.D. 1202, Bill, "AN ACT to Clarify and Correct Laws Related to Real Estate Brokers and Salesmen."

Amend the Bill by inserting after section 2 the following: 'Sec. 2-A. 32 MRSA §4103, sub-§1, ¶E, first 2 sentences, as last amended by PL 1975, c. 767, §66, is further amended to read:

Has-a-high-school-education-or-its-equivalent-approved-by the-commission. If the applicant is applying for a real estate broker's license, he must in-addition have satisfactorily completed an educational course in the field of real estate approved by the commission or been employed as a licensed salesman full-time for at least a year.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to remove the high school diploma requirement.
