IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

AN ACT to Extend a Barber Shop License 60 Days upon Death of the Barber to Allow Transitional Time for Getting a New License.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

32 MRSA § 401, as last amended by PL 1977, c. 564, § 118-K, is further amended by adding, after the 4th paragraph, the following new paragraph:

Upon the death of any person in whose name a shop is licensed, that shop license shall continue to be valid for 60 days following the death of that person.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that when a person holding a barber shop license dies, the shop license shall continue to be valid for 60 days after his death to permit his business associates and employees to continue in operation until a new shop license can be issued.
