#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SEVENTY-NINE

### AN ACT Concerning Warning Signs Posted at Certain Railroad Grade Crossings under the Public Utilities Commission.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

35 MRSA § 821, first paragraph, 3rd sentence, as amended by PL 1975, c. 242, § 4. is further amended to read:

Such bell shall be rung at a distance of 990 feet, on standard or narrow gauge railroads, from such all grade crossings and be kept ringing until the engine has passed the same.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide a warning when a train approaches a grade crossing at a private way.

One such crossing in Wiscasset was the scene of a fatal accident in 1953, and another collision resulting in serious, permanent, personal injuries in 1975. See Hammond v. Maine Central Railroad, 390 A 2.d 502.
