COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1612, L.D. 1722, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to Hunter Safety."

Amend the Bill in paragraph A in the 11th line (9th line in L.D.) by striking out the stricken out words, figure and punctuation "~~for a period not to exceed 5 years~~," and inserting in its place the following: 'for a period not to exceed 5 years,'

Further amend the Bill in paragraph B in the 3rd and 4th lines (3rd line in L.D.) by striking out the stricken out words and figure "~~for a period not to exceed 5 years~~" and inserting in its place the following: 'for a period not to exceed 5 years'

Statement of Fact

As originally proposed, L.D. 1722 would allow the Administrative Court to revoke a hunting license for any period of time for a person who kills, wounds or endangers another person. This amendment will limit the period of revocation to a maximum of 5 years, which is the current law.
