STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY

AN ACT to Amend Training Requirements for Corrections Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

25 MRSA § 2805, sub-§ 1, 2nd ¶, first sentence, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 701, § 5, is amended to read:

As a condition to the continued employment of any person as a full-time corrections officer, as defined in subsection 2, paragraph C, by a municipality or county or by the State, the person shall successfully complete, within the first 12 months of his employment as a **permanent** corrections officer, a basic training course of not less than 80 hours as approved by the Maine Criminal Justice Academy.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to reduce or eliminate the expenditure of funds for the training of corrections officers who have not completed or may not complete their 6-month state probationary employment period when training is scheduled and whose attendance would be necessary to meet basic training requirements within the prescribed time period.
