STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Fishing by Persons Confined to Wheelchairs.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

12 MRSA § 7557 is enacted to read:

§ 7557. Fishing by persons confined to wheelchairs

Any person confined to a wheelchair when fishing in any inland waters of the State open to fishing, may use any method of taking fish permitted under the general open water fishing regulations; provided that the person shall obey any bag limits and size limits established for the particular body of water in which he is fishing.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make it easier for a person confined to a wheelchair to fish. It is often difficult for these persons to fish in waters which are, for example, restricted to fly fishing only. This bill would permit them to use any method of taking fish permitted under general fish regulations as long as they observe the size and bag limits for that body of water.
