STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Prevent Part-time Deputy Sheriffs from Serving as Selectmen.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

30 MRSA \S 951, last \P , as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 431, \S 4, is amended to read:

A full-time **or part-time** deputy shall not hold any other municipal, county or state office, and may reside outside the county during the term of his appointment only with the permission of the sheriff and county commissioners.

STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, full-time deputy sheriffs are prevented from holding any other municipal, county or state office. This prevents them from serving as selectmen. This bill places the same restriction on part-time deputies.
