STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Require Liquor Inspectors to be Uniformed before Entering any Licensed Premise.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 59, sub-§ 4, is enacted to read:

4. Inspectors to be in uniform. Before entering any licensed premises in order to exercise any authority granted by this section, an inspector is required to be in uniform.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill would require a liquor inspector be in uniform prior to entering any licensed establishment for purposes of exercising any authority granted to him.
