STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Authorizing the Town of Lincolnville to Employ a Superintendent of Schools and Supervising Principal.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Town of Lincolnville; authorized to employ superintendent of schools and supervising principal. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Revised Statutes, Title 20, chapter 7, the Town of Lincolnville is authorized to employ a qualified person to serve as superintendent of schools and as a supervising principal.

Sec. 2. Referendum; effective date. This Act shall be submitted to the legal voters of the Town of Lincolnville at a properly called regular or special town meeting or municipal referendum to be called by the municipal officials and held within 60 days after passage of this Act.

The subject matter of this Act to be voted on at that election shall be reduced to the following article:

“Shall the voters of the Town of Lincolnville authorize the school committee to employ a qualified person to serve as superintendent of schools and as a supervising principal?”

The results of the vote shall be declared by the municipal officers of that town and due certificate thereof shall be filed by the Town Clerk of Lincolnville with the Secretary of State.

This Act shall be deemed approved by the Town of Lincolnville upon its acceptance by a majority of the legal voters of that town voting at that election. If the Town of Lincolnville approves the Act, the Act shall become effective July 1, 1982.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to permit the Town of Lincolnville to employ a superintendent of schools and supervising principal.
