STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Undedicate Funds Received from Public Reserved Lands.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 30 MRSA § 4163, as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 623, § 47, is amended to read:

§ 4163. Funds from public reserved lands

All income received by the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands from the public reserved lands, except income provided for in section 4166, shall be deposited with the Treasurer of State, to be credited to ~~a Public Reserved Lands Management Fund which is hereby established as a nonlapsing dedicated fund. Moneys credited to the Public Reserved Lands Management Fund shall be available for expenditure by the Director of the Bureau of Public Lands for the purposes set forth in section 4162 without limitation as to fiscal year~~ **the General Fund.**

Sec. 2. 30 MRSA § 4165, as repealed and replaced by P&SL 1975, c. 147, Pt. C, § 8, is repealed.

Sec. 3. 30 MRSA § 4169, sub-§ 2, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 339, § 12, is repealed.

Sec. 4. 30 MRSA § 4169, sub-§ 3, as amended by PL 1977, c. 78, § 174, is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill repeals provisions of law establishing dedicated accounts for income received from the use or sale of public reserved land. That income would go into the General Fund. The bill also repeals provisions continuing the Unorganized Territory School Fund which arose from public reserved lands.
