HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 111, L.D. 240, Bill, "AN ACT to Permit Auctioneers to Conduct Auctions for Charitable Organizations without Posting an Additional Bond under the Charitable Solicitations Act."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in its place the following: 'The registration fee <u>and bond</u> required by this chapter shall be waived for an auctioneer, when he engages in conduct for which <u>he is already bonded</u>, who is licensed by the Department of Business Regulation and who-has-paid-the-license-fee-required-by <code>Title-327-section-273-and</code> who has otherwise complied with the requirements of that-chapter Title 32, chapter 5-A.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to eliminate the requirement that an auctioneer obtain 2 bonds which cover the same conduct. However, if an auctioneer engages in activity that is not covered by the auctioneer's bond, the other bonding provisions of Maine law would still apply.
