STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning the Habitual Use of Drugs by Podiatrists.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- 32 MRSA § 3655, sub-§ 12, is amended to read:
- 12. Unprofessional conduct. A podiatrist shall refrain from any conduct generally considered unprofessional or unethical by the learned professions including, but not limited to, addiction to the use of narcotics, hallucinogenic or habit-forming drugs.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to provide that podiatrists who use narcotics, hallucinogenic drugs or are addicted to other habit-forming drugs are subject to disciplinary action. The current law contains similar language for pharmacists, physicians, and other related occupations.
