### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Amend the Conditions under Which a Tenant May File a Complaint Concerning the Habitability of a Dwelling Unit.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 14 MRSA § 6021, sub-§ 3, first sentence, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 401, § 4, is amended to read:

If a condition exists in a dwelling unit which renders the dwelling unit unfit for human habitation, and which was not caused by an act of God, then a tenant may file a complaint against the landlord in the District Court or Superior Court.

- Sec. 2. 14 MRSA § 6021, sub-§ 3, ¶B, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 401, § 4, is amended to read:
  - B. The condition was not caused by the tenant, another tenant in the building or another person acting under his control;

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill prevents tenants from filing a complaint against a landlord alleging that the rental unit is unfit for human habitation if that condition was caused by an act of God or by another tenant in the building.
