STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Providing Due Process when the State Liquor Commission Designates a Location for a State Liquor Store.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

28 MRSA § 151-A is enacted to read:

§ 151-A. Prerequisites

- 1. Notice; hearing. No store location, renewal or relocation may be designated by the commission until:
 - A. Notice of location and designation is published for at least 2 successive weeks in a newspaper published in the locality or, if none, in a major newspaper of general circulation serving the locality; and
 - B. After a public hearing is held by the commission in the locality or localities if relocation is proposed for a different locality.
- 2. Findings. The commission designation shall be in writing with supporting findings of fact.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require that before the State Liquor Commission designates a location for a state liquor store, it must give public notice of the proposed designation and hold a public hearing.
