# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Improve the Nursing Home Ombudsman Program's Capacity to Respond to Nursing and Boarding Home Complaints.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Provides one additional staff person

**Appropriation.** The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

## STATEMENT OF FACT

Currently, the Nursing Home Ombudsman Program has one staff person who performs investigations of complaints made by or on behalf of residents of Maine's nursing and boarding homes statewide. To improve the capacity of the Nursing Home Ombudsman Program to respond to the approximately 500 complaints which are lodged with the program annually, this bill seeks funding for one additional staff person plus expenses.

The Governor's Long Term Care Task Force ranked funding for the Nursing Home Ombudsman Program as a high priority.
