STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Permit Liquor Sales on Election Day.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 28 MRSA \S 4, 4th \P , as repealed and replaced by PL 1975, c. 741, \S 2, is repealed as follows:

Liquor may be sold in any municipality on the day of holding a general election or state wide primary after the polls of that municipality have closed

Sec. 2. 28 MRSA § 4, 6th ¶, 2nd sentence, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 770, § 131, is repealed as follows:

Except that wholesalers of malt beverages and table wine may make deliveries to licensees on the day of holding a general election or state wide primary

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill repeals the law banning the sale of liquor on election day.
