HOUSE AMENDMENT " C" to H.P. 577, L.D. 657, Bill,
"AN ACT Relating to the Public Utilities Commission Officials'
and Employees' Compensation."

Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the enacting clause and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 1. 2 MRSA §6, sub-§4, last line, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 489, §1, is amended to read:

State Librarian;

General Counsel of the Public Utilities Commission;
Director of Finance of the Public Utilities Commission; and
Secretary of the Public Utilities Commission.

- Sec. 2. 2 MRSA §6, sub-§5, as amended by PL 1979, c. 579, \$1 and c. 651, §1, and repealed and replaced by PL 1979, c. 663, §3, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
- 5. Range 86. The salaries of the following state officials and employees shall be within salary range 86:

Adjutant General:

Director of Labor Standards;

Deputy Chief of the State Police;

Director of State Lotteries;

State Archivist;

Director of Maine Geological Survey;

Executive Director, Maine Land Use Regulation Commission;

Executive Director of the Maine Labor Relations Board; and
Chairman, Maine Employment Security Commission.

- Sec. 3. 2 MRSA §6, sub-§7, as amended by PL 1979,
 and
 c. 732, §§3/31, is repealed and the following enacted in its
 place:
- 7. Range 83. The salaries of the following state officials and ——employees shall be within salary range 83:

Deputy Adjutant General;

Chief Boiler Inspector and Supervising Elevator Inspector; and Dispute Resolution Specialist.

- Sec. 4. 2 MRSA \$6-A, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 697, \$2, is repealed.
- Sec. 5. 2 MRSA §6-B is enacted to read:
 §6-B. Salaries of Public Utilities Commission
- 1. Chairman. The Chairman of the Public Utilities

 Commission is entitled to an annual salary of \$34,136. Any

 person newly appointed as chairman after October 1, 1981,

 is entitled to an annual salary of \$32,136.
- 2. Members. Each member of the Public Utilities Commission is entitled to an annual salary of \$29,102. Any person newly appointed as a member after October 1, 1981, is entitled to an annual salary of \$27,102.
- Sec. 6. Transition. The incumbents in the positions of General Counsel, Secretary and Director of Finance of the Public Utilities Commission on the effective date of this Act shall be paid at Step C of Range 88.

Fiscal Note

This amendment will result in additional costs to the Public Utilities Dedicated Revenue Account of \$13,419 in 1981-82 and \$17,617 in 1982-83.'

Statement of Fact

This amendment:

- 1. Sets the salaries of the General Counsel, Director of Finance and Secretary of the Public Utilities Commission at Range 88 and provides a transition section for those salaries;
- 2. Revises the statutory provisions concerning the salaries for the Zhairman and members by indicating a specific dollar figure. Any change would have to be approved by legislative enactment. The dollar figure specified provides a \$2,000 raise for the chairman and for each of the members;
- 3. Makes technical corrections to reflect the change made in Title 2; and
 - 4. Adds a fiscal note.
