IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning the Registration of Voters in Small Communities.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- 21 MRSA § 42-A is enacted to read:
- § 42-A. Clerk to act in certain cities

In any city or town with a population of less than 5,000 the clerk and assistant clerk may act as the registrar whenever the registrar and any deputy registrar are both unavailable for any reasons.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill allows the town clerk or assistant town clerk to act as the registrar of voters in towns of less than 5,000, whenever the registrar and any deputy registrars are absent.
