STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Clarify Certain Provisions of Law Relating to the Method of Voting for School Committee Members of the Wells-Ogunquit Community School District.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

P&SL 1979, c. 45, § 6, 8th ¶ is amended to read:

The method of voting by members of the school committee shall be inaccordance in accordance with Method B: Weighted Votes of the Revised Statutes, Title 20, section 301, except that the provisions of that section, restricting to 2% the percentage by which the voting power of a director may exceed the voting power he would have if the votes were apportioned equally, do not apply to this district.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This corrects a problem created by the legislation separating Ogunquit Village from the Town of Wells. The provisions establishing a community school district for the 2 towns creates a method of voting for school committee members that the Attorney General has determined to be impossible to implement. This bill corrects that problem.
