STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Registers of Eligibility for Positions under the State Classified Service.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 632, as last amended by PL 1979, c. 541, Pt. B, § 3, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read:

Notwithstanding any other law, whenever the commissioner gives to any appointing authority a list of the names of persons from which the authority may appoint to a position in the classified service, the list shall contain the name of the highest rated eligible person who is not a state employee or does not possess reemployment rights, provided that the rating is at least as high as the rating of the 6th highest person on register.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to require the Commissioner of Personnel to include the name of one person who is not a state employee on any list of names eligible for a position that is given to an appointing authority, provided that the rating of the nonstate employee is at least as high as the rating of the 6th highest person on the list.
