IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Change the Probationary Period for Teachers from 2 Years to 3 Years.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 20 MRSA § 161, sub-§ 5, 2nd sentence, as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 580, § 16, is amended to read:

After a probationary period of not to exceed 2 3 years, subsequent contracts of duly certified teachers shall be for not less than 2 years.

Sec. 2. 20 MRSA § 161, sub-§ 5, 5th sentence, as amended by PL 1977, c. 24, § 2, is further amended to read:

After a probationary period of 2 3 years, any teacher, who receives notice in accordance with this section that his contract is not going to be renewed, may during the 15 days following such notification request a hearing with the school committee or governing board.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to change the probationary period for teachers from 2 years to 3 years.
