STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Retirement and Benefits for State Employees Returning to Work After Attaining the Age of 60.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

5 MRSA § 1121, sub-§ 1, ¶A, as amended by PL 1969, c. 590, § 4-A, is further amended by adding, at the end, a new sentence to read:

Any member not in service with less than 10 years of creditable service will be eligible for a retirement allowance under this section provided they have a minimum of one year of membership service upon returning to employment after attainment of age 60, and further provided that on the effective date of the retirement allowance, contributions are on deposit in the Members' Contribution Fund.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to amend the State Retirement System law to require that any person who returns to work after attaining the age of 60 must have a minimum of one year of service before they can retire and receive benefits.
