STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Abolish the Position of County Treasurer in York County and Create a Finance Officer.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 30 MRSA § 2, sub-§ 1, \P P, sub- \P (2), as repealed and replaced by PL 1977, c. 657, § 3, is repealed as follows:

(2) Treasurer 3,182

Sec. 2. 30 MRSA § 601, first sentence is amended to read:

A treasurer shall be elected for each county, **except York County**, by the legally qualified voters thereof.

Sec. 3. 30 MRSA § 601-A is enacted to read:

§ 601-A. York County; finance officer

The county commissioners of York County shall appoint a finance officer to serve at their pleasure and with such compensation as they set. The finance officer shall be qualified in matters of business administration and finance. The finance officer has all the authority granted to treasurers under this subchapter and is subject to all requirements of this subchapter. The finance officer shall devote his entire time to the duties of his office.

STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill replaces the elected treasurer of York County with a full-time appointed finance officer.
