COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " \mathcal{A} " to H.P. 833, L.D. 1000, Bill, "AN ACT to Prevent Certain Abuses in Door-to-Door Sales."

Amend the Bill by inserting before the enacting clause the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment unless enacted as emergencies; and

Whereas, the protections afforded consumers by the following legislation generally concern home improvements; and

Whereas, the season in which home improvements are primarily undertaken will begin well before the following legislation would normally take effect; and

Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety; now, therefore,'

Further amend the Bill by inserting at the end before the Statement of Fact the following:

'Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to add an emergency enactor to the bill.
