# STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Gifted and Talented Education.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. 20 MRSA § 3303, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 691, § 17, is repealed.

Sec. 2. 20 MRSA §§ 3304 and 3305 are enacted to read:

§ 3304. Funds available for Maine Governor's School Program

Funds will be made available annually for a Maine Governor's School Program which will be administered by the Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services.

§ 3305. Maine Governor's School Program

Funds made available to the department from state, federal or other sources shall not lapse at the end of a fiscal year but shall be carried forward to the next fiscal year for a period of 90 days to be used for the purposes set forth in this chapter.

**Sec. 3.** Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.
