STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Exempt Illegal Possession of Liquor from the Maine Juvenile Code.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 15 MRSA § 3103, sub-§ 1, \P A, as amended by PL 1977, c. 664, § 11, is repealed and the following enacted in its place:
 - A. Conduct which if committed by an adult, would be defined as criminal by Title 17-A, the Maine Criminal Code, or by any other criminal statute outside that code, including any rule or regulation under a statute except for those provisions of Titles 12 and 29, not specifically included in paragraph E and except for offenses involving intoxicating liquor, as provided in Title 28, section 303;
- Sec. 2. 15 MRSA § 3103, sub-§ 1, \P C, as amended by PL 1977, c. 664, § 11, is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to make illegal purchasing, possession or consumption of liquor by a minor an adult offense rather than a juvenile offense.
