#### STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Establish an Agricultural Exemption from Workers' Compensation for Certain Wood Lot Operations.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 39 MRSA § 2, sub-§ 1-A, as enacted by PL 1975, c. 749, § 2, is amended to read:
- 1-A. Private employer. The term "private employer" includes corporations, partnerships and natural persons but does not include any agricultural employer when harvesting 150 cords of wood, or less, per year from farm wood lots.
  - Sec. 2. 39 MRSA  $\S$  2, sub- $\S$  5,  $\P$  A, sub- $\P$  (6) is enacted to read:
    - (6) Employees of an agricultural employer when harvesting 150 cords of wood, or less, per year from farm wood lots.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill exempts small agricultural wood operations from workers' compensation requirements.
