STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT Concerning Cases which may be Heard in the District Court for the Division of Western Aroostook.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

4 MRSA § 153, sub-§ 3, last sentence, as amended by PL 1965, c. 228, § 1, is further amended to read:

The District Court for Western Aroostook shall be held at Madawaska for criminal and civil business and at Fort Kent and Van Buren solely for criminal business, traffic infractions and civil violations.

STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to amend the statute relating to the type of cases which may be heard in the District Court in Fort Kent and Van Buren in order to reflect the change of some criminal offenses to civil violations and traffic infractions.
