## STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-ONE

AN ACT to Provide for Legislative Review of Agency Rules.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. 5 MRSA  $\S$  8053, sub- $\S$  1,  $\P$   $\P$  C and D, as enacted by PL 1979, c. 425,  $\S$  5, are amended to read:
  - C. Any trade, industry, professional, interest group or regional publication that the agency deems effective in reaching the persons affected;  $\frac{1}{2}$
  - D. The Secretary of State, for publication in accordance with subsection 5; and
  - Sec. 2. 5 MRSA  $\S$  8053, sub- $\S$  1,  $\P$ E is enacted to read:
- E. The joint standing committee of the Legislature with jurisdiction to hear proposed legislation affecting the statutory authority of the agency. A member of a joint standing committee who attends a public hearing on a proposed rule while the Legislature is not in session is entitled to reimbursement for travel and expenses at the rate established in Title 3, section 2.

#### STATEMENT OF FACT

This bill will permit legislative review of proposed rules.
