HOUSE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1479, L. D. 1610, Bill, "AN ACT to Amend the Unfair Sales Act."

Amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§1209." subsection 2, by striking out all of the last underlined paragraph and inserting in its place the following:

'The report shall be filed by postmarking it within 5 business days of the date on which the underpricing occurred.'

Further amend the bill in section 2 in that part designated "§1209." by striking out all of subsection 3 and inserting in its place the following:

'3. Penalty. Any person who fails to file a report as required by this section shall be subject to a penalty of not more than \$500 a day for each day after the first 5 business days on which he fails to file a report by postmarking it. The penalty shall be payable to the State and recoverable in a civil action.'

Statement of Fact

The purposes of this amendment are:

1. To extend from 3 to 5 business days the period within which the report to the Attorney General must be filed; and
2. To clarify the penalty provision.
