SENATE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 642, L.D. 1662, Bill, "AN ACT to Establish and Coordinate Training, Education and Employment Programs for Recipients of Aid to Families with Dependent Children."

Amend the bill in section 5, paragraph F, by striking out all of the 2nd underlined sentence.

Further amend the bill by striking out all of "Sec. 18. Appropriation." and inserting in its place the following:

'Sec. 19. Report to Legislature. The Maine Aid to Families with Dependent Children Coordinating Committee, established in Title 22, section 3773, shall review and evaluate the impact and effect of Title 22, chapter 1054, and report its findings and recommendations to the First Regular Session of the 112th Legislature.

Sec. 20. Appropriation. The following funds are appropriated from the General Fund to carry out the purposes of this Act.

This amendment removes the 10% employment quota set in section 5 of the bill. It requires the Maine Aid to Families with Dependent Children Coordinating Committee to report to the 112th Legislature on the impact of the Job Opportunities Act of 1981 created by section 16. The amendment also reduces the appropriation.
