HOUSE AMENDMENT "\$" to H.P. 1707, L.D. 1699, Bill,
"AN ACT to Require State Bond Issues Passed at the First
Regular Session and the First Special Session of the 110th
Legislature to Include all Interest Involved for each Question
and to be Placed on the Ballot."

Amend the Bill by striking out all of the title and inserting in its place the following: 'AN ACT to Require State Bond Issues Passed at the First Regular Session and the First Special Session of the 110th Legislature to Include all Interest Involved for each Question and to be Placed on the Ballot and to Require that Certain Information Concerning the Referendum on Bath Iron Works Appear on the Ballot.'

Further amend the Bill by inserting at the beginning of the first line after the enacting clause the underlined abbreviation and figure 'Sec. 1.'

Further amend the Bill by inserting before the Emergency clause the following:

'Sec. 2. P&SL 1981, c. 75, §8 is amended by striking out all of the question and inserting in its place the following:

"Shall a bond issue be ratified in the amount of \$28,7300,000 \$33,300,000 for agricultural and economic development, including airport improvements, port facilities which may be made available by sale or lease for use by public or private users and which may possibly increase the chance of nuclear war, feed grain terminal facilities and potato storage and centralized packing facilities?'

## Statement of Fact

The purpose of this amendment is to require that the bond issue referendum question dealing with Bath Iron Works, which will appear on the November ballot, specifically state that passage of the bond issue may contribute to the chances for nuclear war.
