- 1 §7055. Officials with full powers of game wardens
- Sheriffs, deputy sheriffs, police officers, constables, marine patrol officers, wardens of the Penobscot Indian Nation and special agents of the United States Fish and Wildlife Service shall have the powers of game wardens.

23 Statement of Fact

- Section 1 clarifies the intent of Title 12, section 25 7001, subsection 38 and brings it in line with existing 26 fishing regulations.
- Since wardens of the Penobscot Indian Nation have met the training requirements of the Maine Warden Service, section 2 now gives them the same powers as Maine game wardens. This change is in accordance with Title 30, section 6210, of the Maine Indian Claims Settlement.
- 32 Section 3 clarifies the intent of Title 12, section 33 7231, subsection 5.
- Section 4 changes the reporting date for licensed taxidermists so that their annual reports will be consistent with the dates during which their licenses are valid.

 Section 6 makes it clear that any person who intentionally runs down a wild bird or wild animal with a motor vehicle is in violation of Title 12, section 7406. This change will resolve recent enforcement problems involving this law.

Section 7 makes it clear that all accidental collisions between motor vehicles and deer, moose or bear must be reported to a game warden, even when the motor vehicle has not sustained apparent damage.
