Whereas, Acts of the Legislature 12 do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment 13 unless enacted as emergencies; and 14 Whereas, bacterial infection and paralytic shellfish poisoning in contaminated shellfish can pose a grave and 15 16 immediate threat to the public health and safety; and 17 Whereas, under present provisions it may take the Department of Marine Resources up to 4 days to adopt emer-18 19 gency rules closing contaminated shellfish areas; and 20 Whereas, while that department is adopting rules to close contaminated areas the public may be exposed to dan-21 22 gerous levels of pollution; and 23 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 24 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Constitution of Maine and require the following legislation as 25 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public 26 27 peace, health and safety; now, therefore,' Further amend the bill by striking out everything after 28 29 the enacting clause and inserting in its place the follow-30 ing: 31 'Sec. 1. 12 MRSA §6172, sub-§3, as enacted by PL 1977, c. 661, §5, is amended by adding at the end the following: 32 The commissioner shall use emergency regulatory procedures 33 to open areas or waters that have been closed under emer-34 35 gency procedures of this section.

## 1 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to H.P. 1734, L.D. 1719

2 Sec. 2. 12 MRSA §6192, sub-§4, as enacted by PL 1977, 3 c. 661, §5, is repealed and the following enacted in its 4 place:

5 <u>4. Effective date. Except as provided in this subsec-</u> tion, emergency regulations shall become effective immediately upon publication in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the State affected, provided it is submitted to the Attorney General and filed with the Secretary of State as required under the Maine Administrative Procedure Act, Title 5, chapter 375, within the next business day following publication.

Notwithstanding any provisions of the Maine Administrative 13 Procedure Act, an emergency regulation authorized by section 14 15 6172, subsection 2 or 3 shall be effective immediately upon 16 signature by the commissioner or his authorized designee. 17 Upon promulgation of such an emergency regulation, the com-Upon promulgation of such an emergency regulation, the com-missioner shall give oral notice of the emergency closure to local governmental authorities and shall publish notice of the closure as soon as possible in a newspaper of general circulation in the area of the State affected. 26 Emergency clause. In view of the emergency cited in 27 the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

## STATEMENT OF FACT

This amendment provides for immediate closure or reopening of shellfish areas that have been determined to be polluted or contaminated. Immediate closure is necessary in order to insure the protection of public health. The amendment also adds an emergency preamble and emergency clause.
