6 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 738, L.D. 1723, Bill, 7 "AN ACT to Address the Potential Conflict of Interest of the 8 Board of Pesticides Control."

9 Amend the Bill by striking out everything after the 10 title and inserting in its place the following:

'Emergency preamble. Whereas, Acts of the Legislature
do not become effective until 90 days after adjournment
unless enacted as emergencies; and

14 Whereas, existing state law would preclude current mem-15 bers of the Board of Pesticides Control from contracting 16 with the State to provide services; and

17 Whereas, in several cases the members are unique in 18 their ability to provide these services; and

19 Whereas, these members of the board were in fact 20 appointed because of their relevant experience and exper-21 tise; and

22 Whereas, these members will be forced to resign or 23 state agencies will be forced to act without their assis-24 tance unless the current law is changed; and

25 Whereas, in the judgment of the Legislature, these 26 facts create an emergency within the meaning of the Consti-27 tution of Maine and require the following legislation as 28 immediately necessary for the preservation of the public 29 peace, health and safety; now, therefore,

30 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as fol-31 lows:

32 Sec. 1. 22 MRSA §1471-B, sub-§2, 3rd sentence, as 33 enacted by PL 1979, c. 644, §3, is amended to read:

Four members shall constitute a quorum and any action shall
require the affirmative vote of -4- members the greater of
either a majority of those present and voting or at least 2
members.

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Sec. 2. 22 MRSA §1471-B, sub-§7 is enacted to read:

7 7. State contracts. Notwithstanding any other provi-8 sion of law, members of the board shall be eligible to contract with the State where the contracts are awarded con-9 sistent with normal bidding procedures of the Department of 10 Finance and Administration. Members shall also be eligible to receive grants where grants are awarded consistent with 11 12 13 normal state procedures. In no case may any member vote on 14 the award of a contract or grant for which he has submitted 15 a bid or proposal.

16 **Emergency clause.** In view of the emergency cited in 17 the preamble, this Act shall take effect when approved.'

STATEMENT OF FACT

19 The membership of the Board of Pesticides Control was 20 specifically appointed to represent given categories of 21 expertise. This very expertise which makes them valuable 22 members raises questions concerning their ability to con-23 tract with the State in areas where the State could utilize 24 their services.

25 Because of current statutory provisions, board members 26 are prohibited from contracting with the State for services in any area. The Attorney General has refused to sign a 27 28 contract for services by a member of the board even though that member was low bidder. In several instances, individu-als serving on the board are not only those with unique expertise to serve on the board, but have a unique ability 29 30 31 32 to perform specific contractual services for the State. lf 33 they are not allowed to do so, the State will have to seek contracts outside of Maine's boundaries for higher costs. 34 35 The existing prohibitions will force the resignation of 36 board members and will present problems for future appoint-37 ments if those appointments are to continue to be based on 38 meaningful expertise.

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2 In no case could members of the board vote on the award 3 of contracts on which they bid. To prevent the board from 4 being unable to act in those instances where members may ab-5 stain or be disqualified from voting, this amendment also 6 allows decisions of the board to be made by the greater of 7 either a majority of those present and voting or at least 2 8 members.
