9 10 11	Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in its place the following:
12 13 14	'Board members not of state agencies shall be paid daily fees of \$20 \$25 per day involved, plus current state mileage and living expenses incurred on those days.'
15 16	Further amend the Bill by striking out all of sections 5 and 6.
17 18 19	Further amend the Bill in section 8 by striking out everything after the amending clause and inserting in its place the following:
20	' <u>§2059. Fees</u>
21 22 23 24 25	A \$25 fee shall accompany each application for examination and shall not be returnable. When an applicant is notified that he is eligible for a license following examination, he shall remit an additional \$20 to cover the biennial license fee of \$20 before a license is issued.
26	The fee for a biennial renewal license shall be \$20."
27 28	Further amend the Bill by renumbering the sections consecutively.

30 31 32 33	It is estimated that enactment of section 1 of this bill will result in no substantial cost increase. It is further estimated that enactment of section 6 will result in an increase of \$1,000 in dedicated revenue.

This amendment increases the board members' per diem from \$20 to \$25, not \$40 as proposed in the bill. It also strikes those parts of the bill which would change the license period from biennial to annual. Finally, it increases the biennial license fee from \$10 to \$20, not \$30 as proposed in the bill.
