COMMITTEE AMENDMENT " A" to S.P. 739, L.D. 1724, Bill,  
"AN ACT to Adjust the Fees for Licenses Issued by the  
Arborist Examining Board."

Amend the Bill in section 1 by striking out everything  
after the amending clause and inserting in its place the  
following:

'Board members not of state agencies shall be paid daily  
fees of \$20 ~~\$25~~ per day involved, plus current state mileage  
and living expenses incurred on those days.'

Further amend the Bill by striking out all of sections  
5 and 6.

Further amend the Bill in section 8 by striking out  
everything after the amending clause and inserting in its  
place the following:

'\$2059. Fees

A \$25 fee shall accompany each application for examina-  
tion and shall not be returnable. When an applicant is  
notified that he is eligible for a license following exami-  
nation, he shall remit an additional \$20 to cover the bien-  
nial license fee of \$20 before a license is issued.

The fee for a biennial renewal license shall be \$20.'

Further amend the Bill by renumbering the sections con-  
secutively.

It is estimated that enactment of section 1 of this  
bill will result in no substantial cost increase. It is  
further estimated that enactment of section 6 will result in  
an increase of \$1,000 in dedicated revenue.

1 COMMITTEE AMENDMENT "A" to S.P. 739, L.D. 1724

2 STATEMENT OF FACT

3 This amendment increases the board members' per diem  
4 from \$20 to \$25, not \$40 as proposed in the bill. It also  
5 strikes those parts of the bill which would change the li-  
6 cense period from biennial to annual. Finally, it increases  
7 the biennial license fee from \$10 to \$20, not \$30 as pro-  
8 posed in the bill.
