26 27 28	C. Operating assistance to transportation providers in an amount up to 1/2 of the operating deficit incurred in fulfillment of the annual regional operations plan.

Statement of Fact

2 3 4	The purpose of this bill is to permit the State to participate in a higher percent of operating assistance for public transportation providers. The Federal Government
5	is
6	reducing its participation in operating subsidies. This
7	bill minimizes the impact on local communities by allowing
8	available state funds to be used for a greater portion of
9	operating subsidies rather than for capital. At the present
10	time state assistance is limited to 10%.
