	5 MRSA §1001, sub-§25 is amended to read:
	25. Teacher. "Teacher" shall mean means any teacher principal, supervisor, school nurse, school dietitian school secretary or, superintendent or other administrative personnel employed in any public school, including teacher in unorganized territory.
	STATEMENT OF FACT

The purpose of this bill is to include all administrative personnel employed in a school superintendent's office

 as participants in the Maine State Retirement System. The prior definition of "teacher" included some administrative personnel, but excluded others from participation in the Maine State Retirement System. This bill corrects that problem.

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
