17 **AN ACT to Establish the Position of Director**
18 **of Engineering Within the Public**
19 **Utilities Commission.**

21 Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine as follows:

22 **Sec. 1.** 35 MRSA §1, first ¶, 5th sentence, as last
23 amended by PL 1965, c. 91, §2, is further amended to read:

24 The commission shall appoint a secretary ~~and~~, a director of
25 ~~transportation finance and a director of engineering.~~

26 **Sec. 2.** 35 MRSA §1, 2nd ¶, first sentence, as last
27 amended by PL 1975, c. 771, §392, is further amended to
28 read:

29 The salaries of the other subordinate officials and
30 employees of said ~~that~~ commission, other than those of the
31 general counsel ~~and~~, the secretary, the director of finance

1 and the director of engineering, shall be subject to the
2 Personnel Law.

3 STATEMENT OF FACT

4 The purpose of this bill is to establish the positions
5 of director of engineering and director of finance within
6 the Public Utilities Commission, to serve at the pleasure of
7 the commission. The position of director of finance already
8 exists pursuant to Title 2, sections 6 and 6-A. This bill
9 simply includes a reference to the position in Title 35, as
10 well. The position of director of engineering would replace
11 that of director of transportation, which was eliminated by
12 Public Law 1981, chapter 469; an existing vacant position
13 will be used for this employee so that no additional posi-
14 tions will be created.
